

The Gallery in the Grove 2009 Show Schedule

The Gallery in the Grove is a fine art gallery run entirely by volunteers. Our artists are juried and we hold 9 exhibitions a year. The gallery is closed during July, August and December. Shows run for 3 weeks with the opening usually on the first Sunday of the month. Gallery hours are Monday – Thursday from 11 am to 5 pm and Saturday from 11am to 3 pm. We are located on the second floor of the historical Faethorne House in Wildwood Park on Hamilton Road in Bright's Grove. The Bright's Grove Library is on the main floor.

January 4 - 24	The artists of Bear Creek Studio will display their talents with a wide variety of work.
February 1 - 21	A display of fine photographs from the members of the Sarnia Photographic Club.
March 1 - 21	The members of the Sarnia Handweavers Guild will display their work. They will also set up a demonstration with a loom and possibly a spinning wheel.
Mar 29 - Apr 18	Our annual Elementary School Show features the work of young artists from 7 county schools. These schools all take part in our VALS(visiting artists in local schools) program sponsored by the Gallery in the Grove. Much of the work displayed was done under the tutelage of these artists.
April 24 - May 23	Threadworks 2007. "Passions" This juried exhibition of needle arts represents artists from across Canada and from members of the Ontario Network of Needleworkers. The only limitations placed on entries were that they be made with a threaded needle and they not exceed an overall size of 36" by 45". The travelling show consists of 60 pieces and contains a mix of traditional and non-traditional concepts and techniques.
May 27 - 31	This weekend will feature a display of photographs from the county wide Boy Scout Photography Contest. It will feature works by scouts of all ages in a variety of categories.
June 7 - 27	Bruce Flowers, a London sculptor and Pat Gibson, a Woodstock painter combine their talents in a show called "Go Figure" whose purpose is to examine creative metamorphosis. This 2 and 3-dimensional show by two well-recognized artists should prove to be very exciting.
Sept 12 - Oct 2	Mondy Stevenson was born in Beirut, studied art in Beirut, Paris and New York and now resides in Toronto. She has trained at the AGO in egg tempura and Baroque painting and will be showing her portraits and landscapes at the Gallery. Sarah Whiting is a young Sarnia artist who uses sketching, painting and paper cutting to evoke an emotional response to the world around her. This is Sarah's first show.
October 4 - 24	Well-known local artists Kim Yuhasz, Jane Hunter, Kate Kurvink, Teresa Altiman, Mary-Beth Snelgrove and Denise Jones will display a wide variety of works in many different forms.
November 1 - 21	Janet Morris is a Sarnia painter who uses both water colour and acrylics to paint what she sees around her. She strives to capture atmosphere and light in her paintings. "The Dirty Girls" - Carol Kerr, Jane Danic, Stephanie Smalls and Dewy Spizziri are Lambton County potters who have travelled together to take workshops and courses in "Alternative Firing" Their work is unique and exciting and will change your concept of "pottery"
